<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Despite the disruption caused by Covid-19 there have been some achievements at Cupernham Infant School with Primary PE and Sport. • The school has been very successful with promoting active travel. • Children actively engage in a range of lunchtime activities, with good quality equipment. • Children benefit from well planned and sequenced PE lessons. • Healthy eating is promoted through the school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Analysis of playtime incidents show a need both for continued support in how to play and enhance provision of a range of activities with suitable equipment. • Children enjoy travelling actively to school and we wish to build on this success and make it a lifetime habit. • Physical development through outdoor learning is a core part of our offer and this now needs to be further developed across the curriculum. • Children have been at home a great deal through lockdown and so we will offer a range of activities with coaches and external providers to get children moving again and help them find an activity they will enjoy. • Training for all support staff for playtimes and lunchtimes. • Focus on Early Years planning and Schemes of work to ensure coverage and progression of skills across the school, in particular gross motor skills and physical development • Opportunities for more sporting competitions across the school with inter-year competitions

- make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport
- develop or add to the PE, physical activities and sport activities offered within the school
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

The impact will be:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils • increased participation in competitive sport
