



LITERACY

We will be looking at a story set in Australia and we will spend time looking at the characters and the setting of the story.

We will be writing animal fact files with lots of interesting information we have gathered from Jonathan's Jungle visit.

We will be taking a tour around Australia and writing a postcard to send back home.

Key vocabulary – past tense, recount, non-fiction, sequencing, story voice

MATHS

We will be learning about and recapping multiplication and division. We will use sharing arrays to help us and some of us will make links to our number families and inverse.

We will also be talking about doubling and halving and solving problems linked to this skill.

We will be talking about capacity and we will begin to use the correct language linked to this.

We will be thinking about odd and even numbers.

Some of us will be thinking about missing number and learning how we can find out which number is missing from our number sentences.

Key vocabulary – multiplication, division, inverse, double, half, millilitre, centilitre, litre, odd, even

SCIENCE - Animals

We will be recapping the different animal groups and their characteristics.

We will be learning that different animals have different characteristics and how they adapt to survive in different habitats. We will be identifying animals in their local habitats and learning about food chains.

We will be learning about how different animals move in order to survive.

Key vocabulary - Birds, Insect, Fish, Mammal, Amphibian, Reptile, omnivore, herbivore, carnivore, adaptation, variation, habitat, characteristic, food chain, energy, environment, consumer.

THE ARTS AND DT

ART & DT: We will be learning about Aboriginal art and studying pattern.

We will create symmetrical patterns as well as irregular patterns and make our own Aboriginal paper mache masks.

We will also be using marbling ink to create patterns.

Key vocabulary – pattern, symmetry, mould, natural, aboriginal

MUSIC: We will be creating our own Australian music and thinking about the different sounds we can make with instruments. We will also be thinking about how different types of music make us feel.

Key vocabulary – mood, tone, pitch, sound, composer, solo

HUMANITIES

RE

We will be learning about the Easter story and Passover. We also be learning about Holi day and why it is important to people.

Geography: We will be learning about the climate in Australia and comparing it to the climate in the UK.

We will be learning about the different landmarks in Australia, both natural and man-made.

We will learn about the physical and human geography of our local area and compare it to the human and physical features of an area in Australia, using aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features.

Key vocabulary – climate, landmark, natural, man-made, human feature, physical feature, plan, aerial view,

PSHE

- We will be learning about recycling and what we can recycle.
- We will be learning about how to help our environment.
- We will learn who it is safe to talk to and that the children have a right to be safe.
- We will learn what to do in an emergency.

COMPUTING

We will be learning how to program bee-bots to follow an algorithm (set of instructions). We will also be using our problem solving skills to work out what to do if the bee-bot is programmed incorrectly. We will also be learning how to record an algorithm using pictures.

Key vocabulary – algorithm, program, de-bug.

PE

We will be learning all about multi-skills. The focus will be applying our sending and receiving into a game. We will also be having some cricket coaching from 'Chance to Shine'.

Key vocabulary – Radar arm, sending, receiving, teamwork, sportsmanship.
