Our Learning This Week



Year R

We have continued our topic of 'Terrific Travel' and thoroughly enjoyed our Scooter Day. The children had a go at writing a sentence/phrase about their scooter using the sentence starter 'It has...'

This week we have been looking at pictures of Fire Engines from the past and identifying how they have changed over the years. We will then use these to compare with a real life Fire Engine. We have also made some fabulous fire and water collage.

In maths, we have been learning about the numbers 6, 7, 8. This includes making the quantities, representing and partitioning them into different ways.

Within music, we have been focussing on finding the pulse in music, using body percussion and then moving onto the use of instruments to play alongside the pulse.









KS1

Year 1 have had a fabulous week learning again. We have really enjoyed our science work recently thinking carefully about animal survival and the concept of understanding what a predator and prey are. We have moved onto a new book in English called 'The Kings Hats' which the children are really enjoying. Our ballroom dancing is coming along well now and we have really enjoyed learning this new skill. Well done Year 1

Year 2 have had a great week! We started the week by discovering our classrooms had been left in a big mess, as Dirty Bertie had visited. We found it rather disgusting so we wrote him a letter advising him how to stay clean and healthy. Let's hope he listens! Then in English we wrote some amazing diary entries as if we were Florence Nightingale. We thought very carefully about what she would have witnessed and how she would have felt. Our teachers were very proud. We also started a DT topic this week. First we explored different fruit and vegetables and tried to classify them correctly. Many of us were amazed to learn that tomatoes, peppers and cucumbers are actually a fruit because they have seeds! Later in the week we had great fun taste tasting fruit to help us design out own fruit smoothie that we will be creating next week.



HOT TOPIC



Instead of asking....How was school!

What to say to your child/ren instead of "How was school?"

Feelings:

- Did anyone make you feel happy today?
- Did anything make you feel sad today?
- Tell me about one thing you did today that made you feel proud (and why).

Friendships:

- Who made you laugh today?
- Who did you play with?
- Is there someone you want to be friends with but aren't yet?

Learning:

- Can you teach me a song you sang today?
- Tell me about a story you read/listened to today?
- Tell me something you know that you didn't know yesterday.

Classroom:

- What games did you play at breaktime?
- What are you most looking for tomorrow?
- Did you see anyone be kind today?









In June, the children in Year 1 have to undertake a National Phonics Assessment. This requires them to read 40 real and nonsense words covering the sounds that children should know and be able to blend when reading by the end of Year 1. To explain this assessment to parents and provide ways in which you can support your child at home, we are running a parent meeting on **Wednesday 21st February** at 3.30pm-4.00pm. The presentation will also be available shortly after the event for those that cannot attend.



Attendance Counts!

What can I do to encourage my child to attend School?

- Make sure your child gets enough sleep and gets up in plenty of time each morning.
 Establish a morning routine that works for your family
- Ensure that he/she leaves home in the correct clothes and properly equipped. Show your child, by your interest, that you value his / her education.
- Be interested in what your child is doing in school, chat to them about the things they have learnt, what friends they have made and even what they had for lunch.
- Talking positively about the day ahead will ensure your child feels confident and in the right mindset to start their day.

Measles

You will have seen the news regarding the rise in cases of measles in London and the large outbreaks in the West Midlands.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has now declared a national incident in order to focus actions to limit the spread. Further outbreaks of measles will spread to other towns and cities unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination uptake in areas at greatest risk. Children who get measles can be very poorly and some will suffer life changing complications.

To support this incident the Department of Education (DfE) has published: <u>What to do if you think your child</u> has measles and when to keep them off school guidance for parents and for schools.






Bikeability has always been a wonderful success with all our children and Wrens had an amazing time. We are looking forward to seeing the rest of Year R enjoying this same exciting experience.




Safer Internet Day
