#### Year R

We are now learning about minibeasts! Last week we had a special visitor in to show us lots of different minibeasts. Nick from Bugfest, was super impressed with how careful and considerate we were with the minibeasts. This week we have focused our learning on the story of 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar.' We have written some amazing sentences about what the caterpillar ate as well as creating our own fruit kebabs.

#### KS<sub>1</sub>

In Year 1 we have started reading a new book called *The Busy Fox* which the children have loved! We have been writing setting descriptions for both the city and the forest after experiencing this for ourselves outside through role play. We have been learning about ½ and ¼ in Maths using objects and shapes, then moving onto numbers using part-part whole and bar models. We've been busy creating artwork inspired by the work of Kandinsky. Well done Year 1 ©

In Year 2 this week we have been learning about plants and have enjoyed growing our own sunflowers as well as growing cress and investigating whether it could grow without water or light. In Art, we have started learning about Van Gogh and we have been drawing sunflowers in the style of his famous artwork. We have also enjoyed starting our new English unit on the book 'Pattan's Pumpkin'. We loved creating a soundscape using musical instruments to create the sounds of the storm from the story whilst we thought of adjectives to describe the storm ready for our descriptive writing next week.
