### **Our Learning This Week**







#### Year R

This week we have focussed our learning on harvest! We have sung many harvest songs, learnt about the different foods that we harvest in the UK, how these foods are grown and what they are made into. We also learnt about how the harvested foods end up in our shops and the journey that they go through to get there.

In maths, we have focussed our skills on measuring. This has included size, mass and capacity. We have learnt lots of new vocabulary and have had the chance to compare different measurements. Brilliant learning Year R!







#### KS1

In **Year 1** this week we have been acting out the story of The Three Little Pigs. We have then started writing the story and ordering the pictures. We then created art work from this, making houses out of straw, sticks and printing with Lego bricks. Our computing also linked to this story, using our newly learnt skill of drag and drop to create our favourite scene. This week **Year 2** have been busy using their writing skills to retell the story of Goldilocks. Next week they will be using their knowledge of the story to adapt the characters and setting in order to write their own version. In maths, the children have started a new unit of addition and subtraction and have been putting their knowledge of number bonds to

## **Hot Topic – Safeguarding**



#### Speak Out. Stay Safe.

The NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. programme visited our school last Monday to help our Year 2 children have the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse. The NSPCC delivered their Speak out. Stay safe. programme to our Year Two children, with the help of their friendly mascot Buddy.

The NSPCC's work in schools helps to encourage conversations about staying safe and they used a number of child-friendly materials to help you carry on the conversation afterwards. That includes 'The Underwear Rule', a simple way for parents and carers to help keep children safe from sexual abuse – without using scary words.


After our time together, please take me back to school so that I can get ready to make more friends.
