Year R

The Year R teachers were so impressed with how well the children settled back into school; remembering how to demonstrate being 'ready, respectful and safe' around school. Well done Year R! The children were very excited to share their Christmas news and even had a go at writing about it, using a simple sentence. We have launched our new and exciting topic, Terrific Travel! The children have had lots of fun exploring maps, looking at key features, following a map of the playground with a partner and having a go at drawing their own!

They've also been looking at how to be a safe pedestrian whilst crossing a road. The children were brilliant at finding the zebra crossings and remembering to 'stop, look and listen' before crossing. The children are very excited about moving onto their phase 3 sounds, in Phonics, and reading phase 3 words and tricky words! In Maths, the children have explored recognising, making and writing numbers 0-5, before finding 1 more and 1 less of a number, using multi-representation. A great start to the Spring term, Year R. Well done!

The **Year 1** team are so impressed with how the children have come back after Christmas break. They have been instantly hooked by our new topic 'Kings and Queens' and are enjoying our new story The Queen's Knickers. Year 2 have been really focussed after their Christmas break. We are heading towards the halfway stage of Year 2 and have really concentrated on making sure we are ready to learn at the first time of asking. We have been looking at our new book, Greta and the Giants and have been using descriptive and persuasive language in our writing about making sure forests are kept peaceful and beautiful. In maths, we have been looking at shapes and learning all about the different properties of 2D and 3D shapes. It has been a great start to the spring term Year 2! Good job!
