Week 8	<p>Focus sound: aw Focus Tricky Words: some, come</p>	<p>There are activity ideas for each sound at the bottom of this document.</p> <p>Teach sound and rhyme → yawn at dawn. This aw sound is usually found at the end or in the middle of words but can occasionally be found at the beginning of some words. Remind children that they already know the or sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you read these words written down on cards, paper, a whiteboard or post-its? • Word hunt- where can you find words with this sound in when reading? • Can you spell words with this sound in? • Can you write a sentence with these words in? <i>I had to come and draw a jigsaw with a paw. The fawn yawned at dawn.</i> <p>Read and write the tricky words accurately.</p>	<p>Claw Draw Fawn Paw Jaw Jigsaw Straw Awful.</p>
Week 9	<p>Focus sounds: ph and wh Focus Tricky Word: little</p>	<p>Teach sound and rhyme → phone the elephant This sound can be found at the beginning and in the middle of words.</p> <p>Teach sound and rhyme → whisk the wheel This sound is usually found at the beginning of words.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you read these words written down on cards, paper, a whiteboard or post-its? • Word hunt- where can you find words with this sound in when reading? • Can you spell words with this sound in? • Can you write a sentence with these words in? <i>The dolphin was doing his phonics. My little nephew sang the alphabet. Whisk the little wheel when I whisper to you. <p>Week 10</p>	<p>Focus sound: ew Focus Tricky Words: one, were.</p>	<p>Teach sound and rhyme → chew the stew This ew sound is usually found at the end of words. Remind children that they already know the oo and ue sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you read these words written down on cards, paper, a whiteboard or post-its? • Word hunt- where can you find words with this sound in when reading? • Can you spell words with this sound in? • Can you write a sentence with these words in? I blew the stew and then I chewed. When I grew big I flew to the moon with my crew. There were a few new screws. <p>Read and write the tricky words accurately.</p>	<p>Blew Grew Brew Flew Screw Few Nephew Crew New Threw</p>
<p>Week 11</p>	<p>Focus sound: oe Focus Tricky Words: there, out.</p>	<p>Teach sound and rhyme → the toe goes. This oe sound is usually found at the end of words although very few words contain this sound. Remind children that they already know the oa sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you read these words written down on cards, paper, a whiteboard or post-its? • Can you spell words with this sound in? • Can you write a sentence with these words in? I blew the toe out the river. The toe goes to the dolphin. <p>Read and write the tricky words accurately.</p>	<p>Toe Hoe Foe Woe Goes</p>
<p>Week 12</p>	<p>Focus sound: au Focus Tricky Words: what, when.</p>	<p>Teach sound and rhyme → haunted house. This au sound is usually found in the middle of words, although there are a few which have it at the beginning. Remind children that they already know the or and aw sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you read these words written down on cards, paper, a whiteboard or post-its? • Word hunt- where can you find words with this sound in when reading? • Can you spell words with this sound in? • Can you write a sentence with these words in? There is a rocket launch in autumn. When I get an autograph I applaud. What is a sauna like in August. <p>Read and write the tricky words accurately.</p>	<p>August Launch Applaud Jaunt Sauna Autumn Haunt Autograph</p>

<p>Week 13</p>	<p>Focus sound: ey Recap Tricky Words: some, come, little, one, were, there, out, what, when.</p>	<p>Teach sound and rhyme → key for a turkey. This ey sound is usually found at the end of words. Remind children that they already know the ee and ea sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you read these words written down on cards, paper, a whiteboard or post-its? • Word hunt- where can you find words with this sound in when reading? • Can you spell words with this sound in? • Can you write a sentence with these words in? One little monkey jumped across the valley. Some donkeys fell down the chimney looking for the key. <p>Read and write the tricky words accurately.</p>	<p>Donkey Chimney Key Turkey Valley Jockey Monkey Alley</p>
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Activity ideas:

- Picture and word matching games.
- Countdown- read as many words as you can in 1 minute which contain the sound you are learning.
- Putting words around the house of post-it notes to read.
- Use sticky labels to write words to add to a board game like snakes and ladders.
- Read and write sentences with words which include the sound you are learning.
- Dance write- play music and when it stops call out a word for the children to spell.
- Rainbow writing- use a variety of colours to practise tricky words to create a rainbow of words.
- Chalk writing on driveways or patios to practise spelling words and sounds.
- Writing repeater to practise tricky words.
- Tricky word pairs- tricky words written on 2 different colours and children need to find the matching tricky words.
- Roll and Read Mats, Real and alien words, sound bingo, I spy pictures, Picture word matching, buried treasure and what's in the box; which can all be found on Twinkl.
- Twinkl also has short stories which contain focus sounds if you are looking for texts which have lots of examples of particular sounds.
- Buried Treasure, Tricky Word Trucks, Reading Robot, Flashcard Speed Trials and Sentence Substitution; which can all be found on Phonics Play.
