Mixed Yr. 1 and 2 Class - Woodpeckers

This year we are having to create a mixed Yr. 1 and 2 class. We have taken the decision to do this as our current Yr. R and Yr. 1 numbers have been particularly lower than previous years, with Yr. R at 69/90 and Yr. 1 at 76/90. Therefore, from a financial point of view, we are unable to keep our current three form class structure, for the next academic year at least, in KS1. This mixed Yr. 1 and 2 class will be taught and led by our year leader Miss Kirby.

Although mixed classes are very common across many school, we have included some frequently asked questions about this topic to help answer queries you may have about this.

Frequently asked questions:

What is a mixed age year group class?

Mixed age teaching is when two or more year groups are combined to create one class of children. This is especially where the pupil intake numbers are less than the usual class size of 30.

Why are we having a mixed year group class?

We have had a decrease in the number of children on roll this year in Key Stage One and as a result brings with it various financial implications.

• How will two year groups be taught alongside each other in one classroom?

All children are individuals and develop at different rates. Children will be taught to their individual academic needs and not simply to their age/ year group. The teachers at Cupernham Infant School are skilled at teaching classes which include children working on curriculum content which is lively, engaging and purposeful for all learning needs. Teachers will choose work appropriate to the level a child is working at, ensuring that all needs are catered for. To ensure all children access the best learning experience for their year group there may be times when the children are taught in smaller groups in order to support this.

Will my child be held back if he/she is placed in a single or split year group?

We have carefully selected the children who are in each of the Key Stage One classes to ensure they are with friends and peers that they work well with. We will ensure the learning is appropriate and personalised for each individual child and that they cover all parts of the National Curriculum which are relevant to the year group they are in and ensure that objectives which have not been taught within school during lockdown are also met. Work will continue to be targeted and differentiated to your child's individual needs.

How are decisions taken about which children should be allocated to which class?

We have worked together to place the Yr. One and Yr. Two children in the Key Stage One classes, taking friendships and learning styles into close consideration.

• How will we ensure that Yr. 1 and 2 children cope with transition back into a formal classroom environment?

We continue to enhance our transition activities and a curriculum that ensures the children are supported both emotionally and academically. We continue to ensure we meet the needs of each individual child and that the transition back to a formal classroom environment is smooth.

How will we ensure learning is not repeated this academic year and next?

We have planned new exciting and engaging topics for all of our Key Stage One classes which meet the National Curriculum learning objectives for both Yr. One and Yr. Two. We will ensure the learning is new and inspiring for all of the children in the Key Stage One classes and no topic will be repeated.

Will my child miss any opportunities by being in a single or mixed year class?

The engaging topics we have planned for our Key Stage One classes will allow for visitors to come in and support learning. Due to the current Coronavirus situation we are unable to arrange any off-site school trips for any year group. We will ensure that we find further learning opportunities to enhance our exciting Key Stage One curriculum provision. The teachers at Cupernham Infant School will ensure that all children in Key Stage One receive a differentiated curriculum and a wide range of varied opportunities that enhance their learning and ensure they are happy and confident children.
