We will also use the blog and the adapted home learning pages to share homework activities with you and provide you with extra resources to support your child at home.

The Importance of Reading

'Children who have a story read to them each day will hear about 290,000 more words by age 5 than those who don't regularly read books with a parent or caregiver.'



•In Key Stage One we have a selection of books that the children can pick their reading book from.

•In Robins and Hummingbirds the children place their reading books and diaries in two boxes in the mornings. One box is if they need a new book and one is if they want to keep their reading book for another day.

•In Woodpeckers, Kingfishers, Nightingales the children place their reading books in the baskets.

•Please ensure you record any reading at home in the record book. There are pointers in the diary to help you! REMEMBER TO PUT THE PAGE NUMBER!!

- Reading books will be changed on Mondays and Fridays.
- Please make sure books are in book bags every day.

Any books returned to school will be kept in quarantine for at least 72 hours before being returned to the school book boxes.



•We use a wide range of methods to teach reading. Your child will be given a new book once they have read their current book a couple of times. We ask that they re-read a book more than once as this helps children develop their skills of understanding the text. It is also important that children talk about what they are reading and that they can answer questions about a book.

•Guided Reading - Your child will do guided reading at least once each week. A guided reading book will then come home with your child. There will be a focus sticker in the reading diary for you to work through with your child. Please make sure these books are kept in book bags every day.



We love reading at Cupernham Infant School and we enjoy spending time in the library.

The children will have an opportunity to choose a library book to take home each week. They will only be able to borrow a new book when they return their old one. Please make sure that your library book is in your book bag each day as we may have an opportunity to read them in school.

Library change day is a Wednesday for all Key Stage One Classes.



We have spelling lists that are linked to the tricky words and common exception words children should know by the end of Year One and Year Two.

Your child will have a homework book and spellings will sometimes be stuck inside this book. We will also upload the spelling lists to the blog or home learning area on our website.

Please make sure the homework book is in school every day as there may be opportunities to practise spellings within the school day.

Handwriting

Your child will be doing handwriting in class.

In Key Stage One we use cursive handwriting.

The handwriting rhymes and pictures are in the homework books. There are also videos on our website to help with letter formation.

Please encourage your child to form letters correctly when they are completing homework activities.

We will send homework home regularly, along with the spellings. Homework will be sent home on a Friday

Please complete this and return it to school on the following Wednesday unless the homework states otherwise.
