Counting in steps helps us to group numbers. There are patterns in times tables e.g. 5 x table is half of the 10 times table. Multiplication and division are opposites.




What the children will learn in Year 1

What the children will learn in Year 2

- Recall multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5, 10 and 3 times tables.
- Show that multiplication can be done in any order.
- solve problems involving multiplication and division, using materials, arrays, repeated addition and mental methods.

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Some ideas to support learning at home.

Quick fire 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

With a pack of cards turn 2 over and multiply them together.

Count in number families as you go up the stairs.

Play shops and encourage them to pay by counting up money.

When cooking or around the house ask how many groups you could split things up into. "I have 6 sausages. How could I split them?"

Share out items, food or toys practically.

Notice things around you that come in sets. "Socks come in pairs. How many socks would I have if I had 6 pairs?"
