Down on the Farm A Squash & A Squeeze, The Three Little Pigs & Easter 20th February - 31st March 2023

We will begin this topic with a Barnyard dress-up day where we will learn a traditional Barn Dance dressed as our favourite farm animal. We will have a visit from a real Farmer and his tractor and read 'A Squash and a Squeeze' by Julia Donaldson.

We will have a special visit from some real-life farm animals and move onto learning about 'Rosie's Walk'. We will use our knowledge to write the names of farm animals and their young. We will know why an egg is used as a symbol of Easter. During our Muddy Monday sessions we will spot the signs of Spring as well as using mud to paint farm animals pictures.

Key Questions:

What is a farm? What would you find on a farm? What would you see on a farm? Why do we have farms? What animals would you find on a farm? Why are these farm animals? Did you enjoy the farm visiting us? Why/why not? What was your favourite part? Why?
