

Art – Fairy tale Shoes



Overview: We will begin by looking at different shoes and using our pencil techniques to create an observational drawing of a shoe. We will then look at a range of work by the artist Michael Craig Martin to create our own painting of a shoe inspired by his work. Finally we will learn the techniques required to paper Mache effectively to then design and create our own shoe for a fairy tale character.

- I will look at existing examples of paper Mache shoes and identify what makes it appealing and purposeful for the intended character.
- I will design my own paper Mache shoe.
- I will create a paper Mache shoe.
- I will use different materials to make my paper Mache shoe appealing.
