Our Learning This Week



Year R

Year R have had a wonderful start to this half term! Thank you all for coming into school dressed up as a character from 'Room on the Broom' – we all had such a great day.

This week we have learnt about words that rhyme, such as dog and log, cat and hat, etc. We have created our own recipes for a potion by choosing pictures of what we would like to add to it and then labelling it. We are so proud of their super writing and mark making.

In Maths, we have been exploring 1 more and 1 less through the use of songs and stories such as 'Three Little Speckled Frogs' and 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff.'





KS1

Year 1: have had fun exploring part-part wholes in Maths using natural resources outside. We have also been learning about fire safety and how to toast a marshmallow, writing a set of instructions using time connectives. We have started our animal survival lessons in Science and learning all about the 5 groups – fish, birds, mammals, amphibians and reptiles. Finally we have had lots of fun in PE learning ball rolling skills and have started our new gymnastics. Well done Year 1 ©

Year 2: have had a very exciting week! On Tuesday, they were visited by a real life palaeontologist who taught us about fossils and helped us become palaeontologist for the session. They then enjoyed stepping back in time to enquire, research and learn about the life of Mary Anning and the significance of her discoveries. In Maths, the children have amazed their teachers with their ability to add 3 one-digit numbers by looking for the clues such as doubles and number bonds – Keep up the great work Year 2!

Staff INSET day



Hampshire County Council Outdoor Learning Team led our INSET day training this week. We were trained in how to light a fire pit safely and working with children around ponds and open water. We also explored further opportunities to take learning outdoors including, pond dipping, fire lighting and mini den building. Many of the activities covered in our training will now be part of our amazing curriculum.











Hot Topic – Home Learning

"All homework activities should be related to work children are doing at school. However, homework should not always be written work. For very young children it will largely be: reading with parents or carers, informal games to practice mathematical skills, spellings."

Year. 1	1 hour per week or 10-15 minutes per day	 Children read to / with parents Reading and number games, including counting patterns Learn to read common exception words Phonic scrapbook autumn and spring term Spellings summer term
Year 2	1 hour 15 per week or 10-15 minutes per day	 Share reading books and a variety of fiction and non-fiction books Learn common exception words as required Weekly spellings, Weekly maths home learning practice Occasional topic research

These activities are designed to be age appropriate and not disproportionate. We recognise that children need time to pursue wider interests at home. We recognise that it may not be possible to undertake Home Learning every day and these guidelines do not stipulate this.

Home Learning will be set on Thursday and collected in on a Wednesday.






Wraparound Care
