



## **Our Learning This Week**












#### Year R

In Year R, we have started our topic 'All about me'. We have shared the story 'The Family book' by Todd Parr and discussed who lives in our family and how our families are the same/different to others. For example, some families have pets, and some families are big and some families are small. The children have loved sharing their all about me scrapbooks with their friends too (a special thank you for creating these over summer!) Well done Year R for a fantastic start to school, we are so proud of how well you have all settled in to the school routines!

### KS1

#### Year 1

We have started our English unit about traditional tales. We have read lots of different stories and this week we have focussed on 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff.' This has provided us with opportunity to act out the story, sequence the story and also to write sentences about it. Within History, we have continued our learning about the history of toys by finding out what toys our teachers used to play with when they were 5. Within Maths, we have been revisiting and consolidating our number knowledge, such as practising our careful counting, counting on from a given number, ordering numbers and finding one more. #### Year 2

In Year 2, we have started our topic of 'dinosaurs'. We have been reading the story of 'Dear Dinosaur' and writing our own letters to Dinosaur Doris to show her why we are the best children for a job she wants us to do by explaining how we show being ready, respectful and safe. In Maths, we have been learning about place value and thinking about how many tens and ones are in a number and how we can partition two digit numbers. In History, we have learning all about Mary Anning and being history detectives by finding out lots of facts from looking at different sources of information. Great job on an excellent couple of weeks.

## Ready, Respectful and Safe

Cupernham Infant school has three school rules based on the philosophy of "treat other people as you would like to be treated yourself". Our three rules are:

#### 1. I will be ready to learn and show pride and staying power with my work

This means: Children are ready for learning, they arrive at school on time, they have the correct uniform, they have their equipment ready, they show that they are listening and their minds are ready to try their very best.

#### 2. I will be respectful towards everyone, towards property and the school environment

This means: Children are listening when others speak and they respect the property of their friends and the school. They respect that other people have different ideas, beliefs and backgrounds to our own. They respect that people may look different and have different needs but we all feel the same emotions.

#### 3. I will be safe and make the right choices both in and out of school

This means: Children are safe in their learning environment, safe with the people around them and safe in the activities in which they are taking part. They move around school in a safe manner, they follow instructions to keep themselves safe, they use equipment safely, stay safe <u>online</u> and make safe choices in our community.

## **Pupil Voice**



At Cupernham Infants, we feel it is important to listen to our children and value their opinions. The voice of the children is crucial in shaping our school and curriculum. We endeavour to give all children many opportunities to share their thoughts and opinions and play an active role in the decisions that affect their learning and well-being.

We believe that everyone's voice should be heard which is why we have established various groups within school. We also want to provide opportunities for our pupils to develop their leadership skills, be confident and work collaboratively with the teaching teams within school.

In my assembly on Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> September, I will be talking to the children in more detail about the following roles:

**Librarians** (2 representatives per class)

**School Council** (2 representatives per class)

The class will then hold a class election on **Wednesday 2**<sup>nd</sup> **October**, voting for who they believe will be the right person to represent them.

We will then celebrate the elected children in our Friday Celebration Assembly.
